English Language Practise

Unless you are from a majority English speaking Country you must prove you can read, write, speak and understand English to at least level B1 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) scale.

You can prove your English by passing a Secure English Language Test there are 4 widely known tests these are:

- IELTS for UKVI ielts.org/for-test-takers/book-a-test
- Pearson Test for English (PTE) pearsonpte.com/selt-tests/pte-academic-ukvi
- LanguageCert languagecert.org/en/language-exams/english/languagecert-selt/b1-lrws-2714
- PSI online skillsforenglish.com/uk-visas/

You can also prove your knowledge of English by, having a degree-level academic qualification that was taught in English – if you studied out with the UK, you'll need to apply through ECCTIS (formerly UK NARIC) for confirmation that your qualification is both equivalent to a UK bachelor's degree, master's degree or PhD, and that it meets the required English level.
